

#### **Assessment Plan**

## GOAL #1. WRITING Objectives:

- 1. Students will demonstrate an ability to write clearly and concisely for diverse audiences on a variety of platforms.
- 2. Students will be able to apply basic rules of grammar and punctuation to their writing.
- 3. Students will demonstrate familiarity with AP style guidelines.
- 4. Students will demonstrate an ability to choose accurate language reflecting sensitivity in their writing.

#### GOAL #2. REPORTING AND RESEARCH Objectives:

- 1. Students will demonstrate the ability to identify, gather, use, and properly cite primary and secondary sources in reporting a story.
- 2. Students will demonstrate the ability to fairly represent all relevant sides of a story through reporting and sourcing.
- 3. Students will demonstrate the ability to make open records requests in reporting and sourcing a story.
- 4. Students will understand how journalists can use data sets to find and tell stories.

## GOAL #3. INNOVATION Objectives:
