### APPLYING FOR ADMISSION TO THE SPORT MANAGEMENT MAJOR

The Bachelor of Science in Kinesiology and Health degree, with a major in Sport Management, is a restricted program. Students interested in the program must complete required prerequisite courses and apply to the program by the deadline: May 1 for Fall entry or December 1 for Spring entry. Applications may be picked up in Sanchez Building (SZB) Room 2.110. Any questions regarding deadlines, applications, or prerequisite courses should be directed to an Advisor in the College of Education.

### The following criteria are the minimum requirements for consideration for admission into the program and do not guarantee admission:

- 1. Minimum UT grade point average (GPA) of 2.50; the actual cutoff might be considerably higher depending upon the applicant pool.
- 2. Completion of all prerequisite courses with a minimum GPA of 2.50. The GPA for the prerequisite courses will be calculated and the students will be rank-ordered on the basis of the prerequisite coursework GPA. Students may take the Economics course outside of UT, but only courses taken at UT Austin will be utilized in calculating this GPA.

Students interested in applying to the Sport Management major must complete these prerequisites:
