ADDITION OF NEW INSTRUCTOR TITLES TO THE CRITERIA USED TO DETERMINE VOTING MEMBERS OF THE GENERAL FACULTY IN THE HANDBOOK OF OPERATING PROCEDURES 2-1010, GENERAL FACULTY MEMBERSHIP

On behalf of the Faculty Rules and Governance Committee, Professor Jody L. Jensen (Committee Chair and Professor of Kinesiology and Health Education) submitted the addition of new instructor titles to the criteria used to determine voting members of the General Faculty in the *Handbook of Operating Procedures 2-1010*, *General Faculty Membership*. The new titles were adopted at the start of the 2018 fall semester and are considered editorial in nature and do not require approval by the voting members of the General Faculty. In addition, the Faculty Rules and Governance Committee also recommends that *HOP 2-1010* be reviewed every four years.

The Secretary has classified this as general legislation that will be submitted to the Faculty Council for approval on a no-protest basis. Final approval resides with the President.

If no objection is filed with the Office of the General Faculty by the date specified below, the legislation will be held to have been approved by the Faculty Council. If an objection is filed within the prescribed period, the legislation will be presented to the Faculty Council at its next meeting. The objection, with reasons, must be signed by a member of the Faculty Council.

To be counted, a protest must be received in the Office of the General Faculty by February 25, 2019.

HOP 2-1010 GENERAL FACULTY

[Sections 1-6: excerpt from Regents' *Rules and Regulations* "Rule 40101: Faculty Role in Educational Policy Formulation"]

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A. Authority and General Functions

B. Membership

- 1. Voting members of the General Faculty include the following:
 - a. All tenured and tenure-track professors and tenure-track instructors.
 - b. All *professors of practice*, *professors of instruction*, lecturers and clinical faculty who teach organized courses as the instructor of record (with the exception of those listed in B.4. below), who have had a total of two or more academic years of service at these ranks at The University of Texas at Austin and who meet these criteria for an instructional appointment:
 - i. were appointed an average of at least 50% time at UT Austin during each of the two preceding academic years (excluding summer), and
 - ii. are currently appointed at least 50% time at UT Austin (faculty who have served an average of 50% for the past two years become eligible to vote in the next semester they are appointed at least 50% time), and
 - iii. have their primary academic home at UT Austin.
 - iv. Those faculty who satisfy b (i, ii, and iii) will maintain their status except if they fall below an average of 50% appointment for more than two academic years. Also see 4.b below.
