Writing a paper can be tough, and getting it published can seem like a long process. In this talk, we'll unpack both of these things. We'll discuss how to structure a paper and how to organize your thoughts as you decide what to put in it. Then we'll go 'behind the scenes' of the editorial process and look at how editors make their decisions. Please note – it would be great if, before the seminar, you can write a draft of the abstract for a paper that is based on the project you are currently working on and bring it with you.

Before becoming an editor, he did a PhD at Lancaster University, before moving to the University of Manitoba and then the University of Maryland to do postdocs. He then was an Assistant Professor at NORDITA in Stockholm. He started working at Nature Physics in 2017, and became Chief Editor in 2022.
