



What is Qualtrics?

- University-recommended software for creating and distributing surveys and web forms
- Available for free to UT students, faculty, and staff
- Approved for most confidential data (including HIPAA, FERPA, and IRB)
- Survey responses may be subject to the Open Records Act

Don't open Qualtrics yet!

Principles of survey design (borrowed from Earl Babbie)

Choose appropriate question forms

- Consider using both questions and statements
 - Statements are often useful for determining the extent to which respondents hold a particular perspective or attitude
- Decide between open-ended and closed-ended questions
 - Trade-off between range of possible responses and time it takes to analyze

Make items clear

- Items should be precise
- Have both insiders and outsiders review and give feedback

Avoid double-barreled questions

- Make sure you're not asking for a single answer to a question with multiple parts
 - E.g. The UT Libraries should quit buying donuts and serve bagels instead.

Respondents must be competent to answer

- Don't ask something that is difficult to estimate or remember
 - E.g. How many donuts have you eaten in your lifetime?

Respondents must be willing to answer

• Sometimes, people are unwilling to share certain information with us

Questions should be relevant

 If you ask for attitudes on a topic that people are unfamiliar with or don't care about, they're more likely to make up answers

Short items are best

• Don't overcomplicate in an effort to be precise

Avoid negative items

• E.g. "Librarians should not eat donuts"

Avoid biased items and terms

- Be wary of the social desirability of what you're asking
- Language has an impact

Make sure responses are mutually exclusive

• If respondents can only choose one response, there shouldn't be a case in which more than one are true.

Other tips


- Think about what you want to know before you start writing questions
- Ask as few questions as possible
- Imagine how you're going to use your results
- Always pilot your survey
